The Board of Directors heard a request for a waiver of fees from Mr. and Mrs. Herod regarding charges for consolidations and lot splits for their property on Lover's Way.

<u>District Manager Report</u>: Director Peck challenged the need to change the director email addresses. He requested contact information for the District's I.T. vendor.

Board Matters

Public Meetings:

The Board discussed the "Meet and Greet" Candidate forum that Mr. Peck organized and what constitutes a meeting of the Board of Directors.

Mr. Lock explained that while the meet and greet was not an official District meeting, C.R.S. § 32-1-903 and § 24-6-402, could be read to require notice. Out of an abundance of caution, a notice of the meet and greet was posted on the District's web site on Saturday, 4/16/22, and posted at the entryway of the District office in accordance with the statute.

Summary of Information:	
ACTION REQUESTED: Please remove the charges for the consolidation of Lots 4150CS and 4144CR as the consolidation fees have already been paid on all the underlying adjacent lots 4144 through 41502 owned by Tom Herod Jr and Allene D Evans. We simply changed the boundary line between to adjacent consolidated parcels (previously named 4144C and 4148CR) that we owned. We did not change or remove any basis for Baca Water AOS fees. There were 2 parcels before the boundary change and there are still 2 parcels. Baca Resolution 2018-05-01 (2. b.) states that fees"shall not apply" for "making minor boundary adjustments;" Please see attached sheet for more detailed explanation.

EXPLANATION: We ask that the recent charges (\$1500) for lot consolidations for Lots 4144CR and 4250S be removed because they were applied based on an incorrect analysis and information. We own 9 adjacent lots in a row on Lovers Way. They had previously been consolidated into 2 parcels of 5 lots in 4148CR and 4 lots in 4144C. Water is available to all lots, but a sewer line extension from Prosperity Way is required.

After working with the Baca Water District for over 2 years to determine the potential cost of a sewer line extension, we determined that the construction cost to our preferred building site on the 4150 lot, inside the 4148CR parcel, was too expensive and that too many older trees would have to be cut to build our house.

Since we own all of the lots from 4144 to 4152, we could of course build in other areas on our property that would reduce the cost of the sewer line extension by shortening the distance of that extension and by requiring the removal of fewer trees. We determined that the best new location would be in what was previously known as lot 4147 and part of lot 4148. Unfortunately, the border between our two consolidated parcels fell in the middle of our new house location.

Since we own all the nine adjacent lots that comprised these 2 previously consolidated parcels, we went to Saguache County to change the legal border of the two adjacent consolidated parcels that we own.

Our other option would have to been combine all 9 lots into one large parcel. This would have prohibited us from selling part of the property AND eliminated the possibility of the District from having a potential future customer, in addition to us. In fact, we are now under contract to sell that parcel (4150CS); consequently, there will soon be two new District customers on Lovers Way, because of our choice to move the boundary between our two parcels and not make one big parcel.

In addition, in the case of Lot 4150CS, THERE WERE NO NEW LOTS CONSOLIDATED. Lot 4148CR via a Subdivision Application to Saguache County had 2 lots removed to become 4150CS. The Baca Water rules provide no authority for the District to charge fees for removing (or subdividing) lots from a consolidated parcel. There is only authority to charge fees for combining lots through consolidation.

Consolidation is defined as combining two or more lots there by REMOVING one or more of those lots from the tax rolls and REDUCING the number of lots subject to taxes and POA and Water District fees. WE DID NOT DO THAT. In August of 2021 we changed the boundary between our 2 parcels from the line between 4147 and 4148 to a boundary between 4149 and 4150. Before this technical change there were 2 consolidated parcels. After this technical change there are still 2 consolidated parcels. We did not change anything that had to do with the applicable taxes and number of lots subject to Baca Water AOS fees. Therefore, no new consolidation fees should have been charged by Baca Water for either 4144CR or 4150CS.

The practical effect of our boundary change is only that the names of the parcels changed and nothing else. The Consolidation fees of \$750 times 2 should not be legally applicable for simply changing the names of two already existing consolidated parcels.

In addition, in the case of Lot 4150CS, THERE WERE NO NEW LOTS CONSOLIDATED at all. Lot 4148CR via a Subdivision Application to Saguache County had 2 lots removed to become 4150CS. The Baca Water rules provide no authority for the District to charge fees for removing (or subdividing) lots from a consolidated parcel. There is only authority to charge fees for combining lots through consolidation.

Resolution No. 2018-05-01

CONCERNING THE IMPOSITION OF VARIOUS FEES, RATES, PENALTIES AND CHARGES FOR WATER AND SANITARY SEWER SERVICES AND FACILITIES

1. Definitions:

"Consolidation" shall include every action by which separate parcels of real property are combined into one parcel of real property.

Previous consolidations combined all of the 9 lots into 2 parcels. No additional lots were combined into these parcels. We simply changed the boundaries and the names of the existing parcels.

2. THE FEES AND CHARGES.

b. Transfer and Consolidation Payment. The Transfer and Consolidation Fees **shall not apply** to any of the following Transfers, ... Any Transfer made and delivered...;

making minor boundary adjustments; removing clouds of title; or granting easements, rights-of-way or licenses.

BACA GRANDE WATER AND SANITATION DISTRICT RESPONSE

1. HEROD REQUEST: (attached)

To waive fees related to the consolidation of Lots 4150CS and 4144CR, because they are based on an incorrect analysis and information. Customer states "Consolidations" are defined as combining two or more lots and the process he went through was simple a boundary name change.

- 9/23/2021: Resolution # LU-2021-49, Reception # 394570. To separate <u>4148-CR into 3 lots.</u> 4150S, 4148S, 4149S, N/K/A Lot 4150-S. (Lots 4149-S and Lot 4148-S)² District charged \$750.00

The District inquired with Saguache County Land Use, they stated Lot 4150 is N/K/A Lot 4150-CS, lots 4150, 4151, 4152 are included in this parcel. We still do not have a clear resolution that states this nor is it reflected on the County Parcel Viewer or Assessor web site.

BACKGROUND:

In June 2021, the Baca Grande Water and Sanitation District received two requests from the Saguache County Land Use Dept. The first request was for a subdivision exemption³ and the second for consolidation⁴. We did not receive a request for a property line adjustment. The owner, Tom Herod also sent an explanation for the requests, that in 2020 he purchased lots 4152 and 4148 and consolidated them with lots that they already owned. After the consolidation was completed, Mr. Herod stated he had made a mistake in consolidating these lots into one parcel described as 4148CR (see June 15, 2021 Letter of explanation, from Tom Herod).⁵

In July 2021, as is the District's practice, certified letters were mailed to the owner and to Saguache County stating that the District has no objection to the requests. The customer is also informed via certified mail that upon receipt of the County approval resolution, a fee of \$250 per lot will be assessed by the District. **Note-** the Baca Property Owners Association guidelines do not permit splitting lots following consolidation, but since the county permits it, they must comply. It is rare to see this type of request. The District does occasionally receive property line adjustment requests but there is no change on the account or additional work for staff for a lot line adjustment as it does not affect the billing account. A split of consolidated lots adds the same amount of work as a consolidation does, therefore it is treated the same way as a consolidation of lots.

THE PROCESS:

District staff perform the same actions for consolidations and lot splits. It is not a matter of simply renaming an account as the customer mentions in the attachment; it is a matter of creating a new parcel account that accurately reflects which lots are included in a consolidated parcel. A number of actions are performed to verify there is no reason for objection to the lot consolidation request. Each account is carefully reviewed for status of the tap fee, availability of services, any green belt or easement issues, meters that may be associated with the parcels, unpaid fees owed, etc. These actions are performed upon receipt of the request from Saguache County. Letters are then sent to both the County and the customer to notify them that the District has no objections to the request. The customer letter is sent certified to assure us that they

have received the letter that includes not only the approval from the District but also the total cost of the consolidation or split should the request be approved from the County. Once the District receives County approval, we perform several steps in our software that include changing location notes, final billing the consolidated accounts, and creation of the new account that includes the lots included in the new parcel. Detailed notes are written on the account for tracking purposes and a final letter is sent to the property owner. 6

CONCLUSION:

Per District Resolution No. 2020-03-02, "Consolidation" shall include <u>every action</u> by which separate parcels of real property are combined into one parcel of real property.

District staff have spent many hours on this particular request because the final consolidated resolution was unclear. Staff worked hard to complete this request by communicating with the Baca Property Owners Association, the Saguache County Land Use Dept., the County Assessor and local realtors.

The fees charged are appropriate based on information received from Saguache County.

RESOLUTION LU-2021 - 49

RESOLUTION, granting a Subdivision Exemption from the Land Development Code of Saguache County.

WHEREAS, Tom Herod Jr. and Allene D. Evans have applied for a Subdivision Exemption in order to divide a parcel of land within the Baca Grande Chalet Unit Two, Lot 4148-CR containing 2.545 Acres, into three lots. 



LETTER OF EXPLANATION
RE SUBDIVISION EXEMPTION AND CONSOLIDATION APPLICATIONS

Dear Commissioners:

Thank you for previously approving our application to consolidate Lots 4148, 4149C and 4152 into 4148CR on Lovers Way in Chalet 2 of the Baca Grande.

In 2020 we were able to purchase 4152 and 4148, which were adjacent to lots that we already owned, 4149C and 4144C. We chose to consolidate those new lots with 4149C where we intended to build a residence.

Unfortunately, we made the consolidation judgment before attending the Baca POA's Firewise Zoom presentation and spending the month of May in the Crestone area. It became clear that we chose the wrong location for our house for fire and sewer access reasons. We made a mistake.

By walking the land instead of studying maps on paper, it is clear that it would be better for us to build on what were originally Lots 4147 and 4148.

We now own 9 lots (in two consolidated parcels) in a row on Lovers Way (formerly lots 4144, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52). The purpose of our applications for a Subdivision Exemption and Consolidation, is to simply change theorder between our two parcels from what was lot 4147 and 4148 to a new border between what was lot 4149 and 4150, making what were 4148 and 4149 a part of the downhill parcel, 4144C, instead of part of our uphill parcel (currently 4148CR which will become 4150S if you approve our applications). The result will remain 2 consolidated parcels, just different borders.

We apologize for our previous error in judgment and for asking the Commissioners to go through this consolidation process with us a second time. We greatly appreciate your patience and consideration of this request.
